A night of unbridled fun at the Shalimar turned nearly deadly for one woman. It's not clear from GPD Officer Eric Lope's report why Shondiin Rosales struck the victim across the forehead with a beer bottle, leaving an 1.5 inch gash on her head, and a cut to her nose.

The victim said that Rosales, 22, was trying to start a fight with her, but she tried to ignore her. Rosales was arrested for aggravated battery with a deadly weapon.

HEAD STOMPING

A woman called for police when a fight between her boyfriend and dad escalated into a violent escapade that resulted in some injuries. The woman said her boyfriend, Todd Quam, was “stomping on the stepdad’s face and head with his shoe.”

When GPD Officer Norman Bowman arrived, he observed the victim lying on the ground with his face covered in blood. He was unconscious. Quam, 42, was intoxicated, and Bowman learned that he had several bench warrants. The victim was transported to a local hospital with injuries, and Quam was arrested for aggravated battery.
