
WASHINGTON, D.C. – Navajo Nation President Jonathan Nez was at the White House in Washington, D.C., on Sept. 13 as he joined the U.S. President Joe Biden, Vice President Kamala Harris, key cabinet members, and Congressional members for the ceremonial signing of the Inflation Reduction Act, which received final passage by Congress on Aug. 12.

The Act authorizes over \$700 billion and addresses policies related to climate change, energy, taxes, and health care costs aimed at improving the country's economy. For tribal nations, the new law provided funding to plan for and adapt to climate change, mitigate drought, support fisheries, and support for clean energy production and use.

"The Navajo Nation has a seat at the table with President Biden and his administration. The American Rescue Plan Act delivered over \$2 billion to the Navajo Nation, the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law is delivering millions more, and now the Inflation Reduction Act will help our people with drought mitigation, clean energy initiatives, lower prescription costs, and much more. We are making progress and moving forward with infrastructure development, cleaner energy development, and other areas that are critical to building our Nation and to bring more of our people home," Nez said.

He thanked the federal government and the people who helped pass the act.
